The programme

Bring it on Brum is a programme funded by the Department for Health designed to help children, young people and their families to experience a fulfilling, active and fun school holidays.

The background

Bring it on Brum has been implemented since 2021 to address holiday hunger, inactivity, isolation and learning loss among some of the most vulnerable children in the city.

An Overview




Birmingham has the highest number of children eligible for free school meals in England (70,500).



The History

Since 2020, the Golf Foundation have supported BIOB in the form of a community package including equipment and training to community groups in under-served parts of Birmingham. This support has seen us train 25 organisations to faciliate golf in their local communities.

By working in collaboration, the Golf Foundation are proud to play an important role in offering safe, enriching and inspiring activity, whilst enabling leaders to develop and learn new skills.

Since the start of the Bring It On Brum programme in 2020, The Golf Foundation have built on, and developed strong community links with organisations operating across underserved areas of Birmingham.

This has allowed us to introduce, facilitate and embed golf provision across the city with groups receiving equipment, resources and training to feel confident to offer golf in their future programmes.

providing access to innovative community resources for groups to feel supported and inspired to continue their golfing journey




Ongoing support from Golf Foundation in the form of training, advice and community packages




Access to GolfSixes Mini League resources and playing opportunities for groups to encourage regular participation across the year


